hebden bridge ...

FOR A FAMILY STROLL

The Rochdale Canal towpath offers level walking from the heart of Hebden Bridge. Kingfishers may share the canal side with you. Or explore the Nutclough Woods, easily reached from the town centre.

FOR A SHORT WALK

We have created three waymarked walks from Hebden Bridge which you can follow without the need for a map or guide. Choose between the riverside walk to the National Trust woodlands at Hardcastle Crags, the more energetic walk to the fascinating hilltop village of Heptonstall, or the more strenuous route to Stoodley Pike obelisk. More details are on information boards at Hebden Bridge station and town centre.

for a day on the hills

Walk above Hebden Bridge on paths first used by packhorse trains to carry cloth across the hills. Visit Churn Milk Joan, the standing stone on Midgely Moor, or explore the old water mills in the Colden valley.

Enjoy your right to roam in the wild open moorlands near Hebden Bridge.
